SLAVA UKRAINI prompted the pace outside ICE SHARD while confidently handled, poked a head in front leaving the half, spurted away under little encouragement heading exiting the far turn, responded to firm asking leaving the three sixteenths and steadily drew away. GLOBAL EMPIRE , between rivals early, dropped inside for the backstretch run, edged up while saving ground nearing mid stretch and kept on willingly to be clearly second best. ELECTRIC CHARGE lagged back early, was under a ride leaving the far turn, circled four wide with a progression into the lane, chased to mid stretch then flattened out. ALVIN drafted back off the pace while saving ground, came under a ride around the final turn, remained inside into the stretch but came up empty. ICE SHARD was nudged clear early and set the pace towards the inside, took outer pressure from the winner leaving the five eighths, ceded command into the far turn, shifted out to about the three path to pursue, remained a presence to mid stretch then weakened. LINE TO GAIN broke outward and a step slow, corrected and moved up four wide into the first turn, stalked outside the leaders to the far turn, faltered past the three eighths and was eased late.
