WIND OF CHANGE (BRZ) moved up after being a little slow to get going, took over the lead passing the five-sixteenths marker still in-hand, sprinted clear when roused in upper stretch, and drew away under a hand ride. TIGER DAD was outpaced early, advanced under a drive through the turn, and finished up well to gain the second spot while no threat to the winner. GOLD MEMBER was coaxed forward from the break, took over the lead from SIDETOWN near the seven-sixteenths marker, was immediately taken on by WIND OF CHANGE (BRZ) heading into the turn, was no match, kept on and managed to hold on for the minor award. SHARP LORENZO stalked the early pace three-wide, was in contention between horses to the stretch, then finished evenly. WEIRD YEAR lacked any early speed, went four to five wide into the stretch, and ran on some to improve while never a serious threat. FORT HOOD raced close up to the turn, then dropped off the pace and chased the field home the rest of the trip. SIDETOWN sprinted clear early, was overtaken heading into the turn, retreated through that turn, and tired.
